NEW Reader's Theater

Reader's Theater is a style of theater in which the actors (readers) do not memorize any lines. Each reader, reads his/her lines using only vocal expression to help the listeners understand the story rather than using visual storytelling aides such as sets, costumes, intricate blocking, and movement. Readers Theatre is also known as Chamber Theatre or Interpretive Theatre. It became popular during and following the Second World War when resources to produce plays were scarce. The original Readers Theatre were presented using only scripts and stools or chairs. The material performed was plays, poems, narrative fiction, and non-dramatic literature. The Center welcomes interested actors/readers and audience members to gather at the Center on Monday, February 23 at 11:00. We'll provide a script of a short play - no memorization required. AARP Tax Preparation Appointments

Volunteer AARP preparers will once again be at the Center on Tuesday and Thursday each week to help members complete and file their 2014 Federal and IL tax returns. Tax preparation appointments are now available for all dates beginning Tuesday, February 3. AARP volunteers are trained and tested in current tax law using materials from the IRS. They can complete most tax forms including 1040EZ, 1040A, and 1040 with schedules. However, please see a professional tax preparer for complicated returns.
