Illinois Holocaust Museum Trip Rescheduled

We've rescheduled the Center trip to the Illinois Holocaust Museum in Skokie for Wednesday, April 10. Our group will have a docent-led tour of the museum's permanent exhibition which tells the story of the Holocaust, from pre-war German life through ghetto life and concentration camps to eventual liberation and resettlement throughout the world. We will leave the Center at 9:00 am for the approximately one-hour ride to Skokie. After leaving the museum, we'll stop for lunch at Maggiano's before returning to the Center. A minimum of 15 participants is required for this trip. The cost is \$35 (round-trip luxury coach bus transportation, museum ticket, and a family style lunch at Maggiano's). They can complete most tax forms including 1040EZ, 1040A, and 1040 with schedules. A photo ID (driver's license, State ID, passport), social security card or Individual Taxpayer Identification notice, a copy of last year's tax return, all income documents like W-2 and 1099, brokerage statements, and any other tax information specific to your situation must be presented at your appointment.
